BACKGROUND KNOWLEDGE

Why background knowledge??

The answer is simple, is to make sure you understand!

What is background knowledge??

Background knowledge is the information that is <u>essential</u> to <u>understand</u> a concept, a situation or a problem.

For example, in your book Interesting Stories lesson #3, we talk about globalization. Globalization is a concept that we hear a lot nowadays, but do we really understand what it means??

To understand the text of Lesson #3, it is essential to understand the word "globalization" and its background knowledge.

There are few steps you have to do, you choose a keyword, then:

When you are reading or listening to someone's idea, you must <u>identify</u> the keywords to make sure you understand the <u>main ideas</u>.

Then, the <u>first step</u> you must do to make sure you understand the keywords' meaning is to <u>find the definition</u>.

← 1. Search for the definition

→ When you do not know or want to make sure you understand the word/words meaning. Look for the definition (dictionary or Internet).

3 ways to prove that you really understand

- ← 2. Explain in your own words → Try to explain the words or the concept in your own words.
- ← 3. Concrete example → When you understand the words/ concept, try to give a concrete example in another context.

How to research background knowledge



How to research background knowledge

- ⇔ 5. Ask yourself questions → What is the history behind the words, concept? When did we start using the words, concept? Where do the words, concept come from? Do the words, concept mean the same everywhere?
- ← 6. Historical context → When words or concepts are linked with a historical context.*not always the case

Example Keyword chosen: "Globalization"

- → Search for the definition → "Globalization is the process by which businesses or other organizations start doing business on an international scale."
- ← Explain in your own words → A business or organization that does business, or have interactions with businesses from other regions, other countries.
- ⇔ Give a concrete example → Samsung products that are designed in South Korea, but they buy their components from China.

Connect it to your own life → The clothes I buy in Canada are featured

- on instagram by Japanese and Colombian models. The clothes are manufactured in the United States, and are delivered to me by DHL, a German shipping company.

 → Ask yourself questions → When did we start using the word?

 The contemporary process of globalization likely occurred around the middle of the 19th century as increased capital and labor mobility coupled with decreased transport costs led to a smaller world.

- → Historical context →

Territorial expansion by our ancestors to all five continents was a critical component in establishing globalization. However, globalization failed to accelerate due to the lack of long-distance interaction and technology. Globalization results in the expansion of international cultural, economic, and political activities. As people, ideas, knowledge, and goods move more easily around the globe, the experiences of people around the world become more similar.
