Welcome to Hyogo Prefectural Awaji Special-Needs Education School

After Hyogo Prefectural Awaji Special Support Education School (兵庫県立淡路特別支援学校) and Hyogo Prefectural Special Needs Education School for the Deaf (兵庫県立淡路聴覚特別支援学校) were merged together, Hyogo Prefectural Awaji Special-Needs Education School (兵庫県立あわじ特別支援 学校), whose name was changed into hiragana, was established in April, 2011.

Our school is the sole special-needs education school in Awaji district. We provide guidance related to career education and vocational education to students with visual impairment, hearing impairment or intellectual disability, as well as students with physical disability or health impairment, in a similar way to elementary and junior and senior high schools while taking special care in accordance with the type and level of disabilities of individual students.
