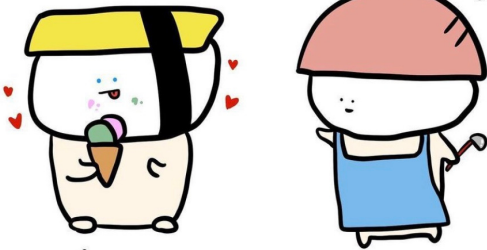

Read left to right



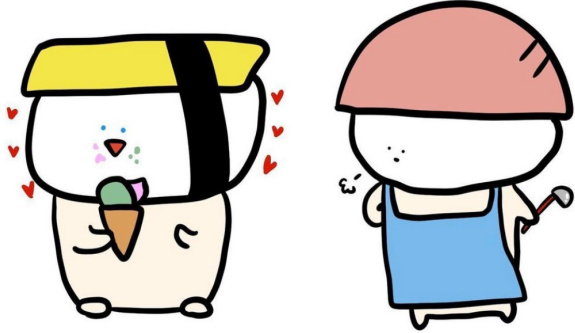
"I'm obsessed with OO." in Japanese

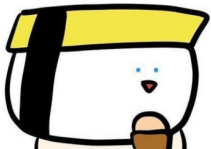
This is a phrase you can use
